On March 15, 2012, the Governor signed into law a Senate and Assembly redistricting plan that had passed both houses of the Legislature after a series of 23 statewide public hearings. The plans were then submitted to the United States Justice Department for preclearance under Section 5 of the Federal Voting Rights Act, that affects three counties (Bronx, Kings, and New York).

On March 19, 2012, a three-judge panel (U. S. District Court for the Eastern District of New York) imposed a 2012 Congressional redistricting plan for New York State. Due to the Federal Court's authority, the redistricting plan did not have to be signed into law.

The Legislature, with the assistance of the Legislative Task Force on Demographic Research and Reapportionment, continues to make the redistricting process open and accessible, and is very gratified by the exceptional level of public input from a broad cross-section of communities.

In continuing our effort to keep the public informed, we believe that this series of legislative publications completes the 2012 New York State legislative and congressional redistricting process.

Again, thank you for contributing your time, energy, and insights to this historic, once-in-a-decade responsibility.

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Explanation of District Profile Data

The American Community Survey

The U. S. Census Bureau created the American Community Survey (ACS) to replace the long-form (detailed) questionnaire used during prior decennial censuses. The 2012 Congressional District Profiles are based on the ACS 2008–2012 5-year estimates dataset released by the Census Bureau in December, 2013.

The decennial census is a complete (100%) count of the U. S. population. In contrast, the Census Bureau selects a random sample of addresses (rather than persons) each year for ACS inclusion. Estimates based on a sample (ACS data) will differ from true figures based on a population (decennial-census data). The larger the sample, the smaller the difference (the "margin of error" in statistical terms).
